

## Philippe Meyer Prize in Theoretical Physics

The Philippe Meyer Institute of Theoretical Physics at the Ecole Normale Supérieure in Paris is opening the call for the fourth edition of the “Philippe Meyer Prize in Theoretical Physics”, to be awarded in 2020, to acknowledge exceptional contributions to the field of

### **Statistical Physics of Out-of-Equilibrium Systems.**

The subject should be interpreted in a large sens, including classical or quantum systems, as well as systems in biophysics etc.

This International Prize for a Young Researcher is awarded every two years. Previous laureates can be found at <https://www.ipm.ens.fr/>. The Prize consists of a financial award (10,000 euros), in addition to an invitation to spend one month as a visitor at the Philippe Meyer Institute of Theoretical Physics. It aims at rewarding exceptional contributions to the field of Theoretical Physics by a young researcher who is still in the first ten years of his/her scientific career. For the 2020 edition this means that the nominees should have obtained their PhD after January 1st 2010.<sup>1</sup>

The selection will be made by an International Jury of experts in the field. Their names will be published in the Prize web page after the selection of the laureate.

Nominations for the Prize are open to all members of the international scientific community. Self-appointed candidacies will not be accepted. Persons holding an appointment at Ecole Normale Supérieure are not eligible to receive the Prize.

The nominations should include a CV of the candidate, a letter of presentation, and should be addressed to : [ph-meyer.prize@ens.fr](mailto:ph-meyer.prize@ens.fr)

The deadline for nominations is June 30, 2020.
